1. You need to start by having access to the “Layers” tab. It can be found at the bottom of the Information Panel – see the red ellipse at the bottom.
2. Once you can see the “Layers” tab, all GIS Layer folders (“+” signs) containing GIS Layers should be visible (see left).
3. The “Filter Layers” tool above the Layer List (see red box) should be visible - (if not, click on the “I Want to...” drop-down tool and scroll down and choose the “View Maps Layers List”).
